Skills & training, safety, sustainability, wellbeing, community




## **SKILLS & TRAINING**

This is why we set up our sister organisation the National Demolition Training Group (NDTG) as well as the CCDO card scheme. Here's the 2024 overview:


#### CCDO Cards issued in 2024








#### CCDO Cards issued by region 2024

You can see here the abundance of CCDO (Green) Labourer cards and this raises safety concerns.

Many operatives holding the Labourer card use it to get site access easier but are undertaking demolition activities without the appropriate training for the activities; those holding Labourer Cards are doing the responsibilities of a DRO or ADO and in some instances undertaking supervisor duties.

This can be unsafe. To address this we are reducing the CCDO Labourers card to a validity of two years to persuade employers to upskill their workforce to the appropriate level of training.



With the CCDO (Green) Labourer card validity moving down to two years, we anticipate a broader distribution of red Trained Operator cards next year.

We also hope this makes Demolition Chargehand a more viable upskilling option for operatives.

This change will encourage structured development within the workforce, fostering a safer and more skilled demolition industry.

### **Demolition and Retrofit in National Planning Policy**

NFDC distributed a significant study that will influence government policy and impact the industry. 
## NFDC Talks 'Intelligent Demolition Planning' Seminars

## WELLBEING




Our focus on wellbeing always come in two parts; mental and physcial health. We used our profile to hone in on a handful of important causes.
